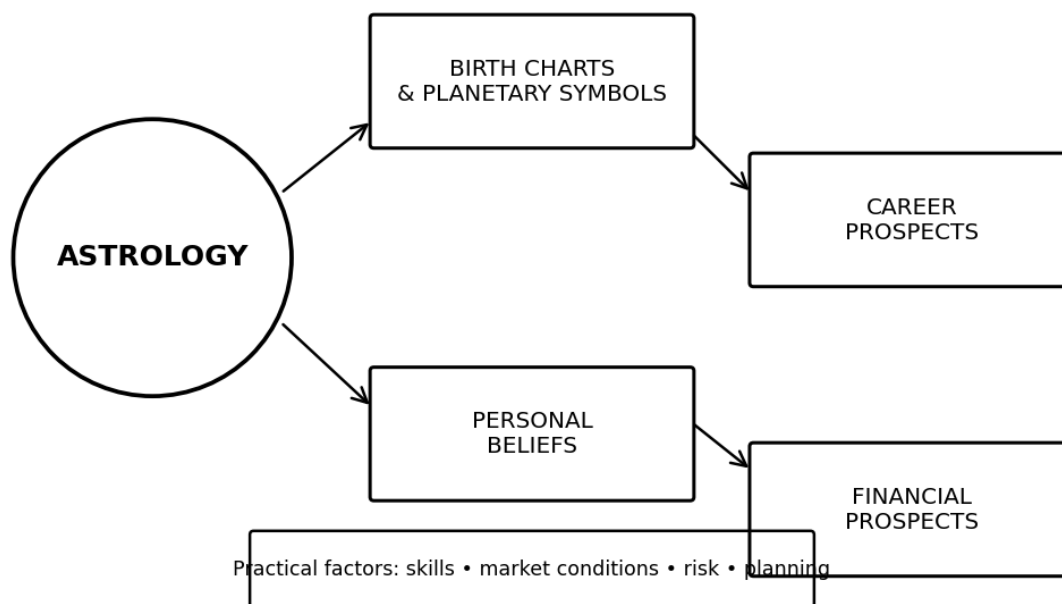


Figure 1. Astrology, career prospects, financial prospects, and practical decision-making.
